



A warm festive welcome to the players, supporters, and officials of Hanwell Town. Games between the two teams are usually close and there is no reason to expect anything different with this encounter.

Writing programme notes over the Christmas period is fraught with challenges with a plethora of fixtures and footballing events occurring between writing this piece and today's fixture.

The Frome Town match was a disappointing afternoon as Marine had an off day and the Robins took advantage. On a tacky and bumpy surface Marine struggled to get their usual passing game going. It was not lack of effort and much more a case that too many players just seemed short of their best. Reasons? Who knows? What us followers are rightly not privy to is those players carrying knocks or those who might have had an illness in the week. Sometimes factors unknown to a club's supporters can influence the result.

There is temptation as supporters to see games against sides like Frome Town who are at the wrong end of the table as an automatic win. The league Marine are in is not like that. Against any team from top to bottom if you have an off-form day you will not win. Last year and at the time winless Marine beat Chesham United whilst promoted Salisbury were twice unable to beat relegated Didcot Town. At Marine's level the reality is no match is an easy one.

Watching Premiership football on the television in recent days a couple of unseemly incidents struck me. Kyle Walker's thespian collapse as Rasmus Hojland's head brushed his was excruciating to watch. Then on the same day in a match against Brentford Chelsea's Marc Cucarella deliberately ran into an opponent and then collapsed to the ground holding his head. It was an unedifying attempt to dupe the officials that an opponent had hit him.

I am caught between being appalled by the cheating of these two players and bemused by their half-wittedness. Do they genuinely believe that in this age of VAR and television cameras their cheating will go unnoticed?

The sad reality is that this type of cheating is not an accident - it is a choice. This diving to get a fellow player sent off should, in my view, be subject to retrospective sanctions so that the message gets out to the cheats that they will not be allowed to prosper.

On a more positive note, it was positive to hear that ex-Swindon Town player Chris Kamara will be returning to our TV screens. The way he has faced up to his brain disorder with courage, openness, and humour is impressive. It is also brilliant that he is working to support children with speech and language needs. I am sure all of us at Swindon Supermarine wish him well on his return to match reporting duties.



HISTORY:

Hanwell Town was originally founded in 1920 by a team of 'Geordies' working in the area, and it is believed that this explains the black and white striped colours which are still used today.

The club were in the London League from 1924 to 1927 and it was in this period that they won their first major honour, sharing with Roxeth and Harrow Old Boys the Middlesex F.A Junior Charity Cup in 1926. Little else is known about the club before their disbandment at the outset of the second world war.

The club reformed in 1947/48 playing in the Dauntless League where they climbed up through the divisions earning promotion in four successive seasons.

Whilst remaining in the Dauntless League with a third eleven, the club switched allegiance to the Harrow Wembley and District League where they remained until 1969/70.

During their period in the Harrow and Wembley League the club reached eight cup finals in various league and county competitions and each time finished on the losing side.

In 1970/71 the club gained promotion to the Middlesex County League and in their very first season the club won the League cup, the side being captained by the club's current chairman Bob Fisher.

The club remained in the Middlesex County League throughout the 1970's playing at Ealing Central Sports Ground, their home for over twenty years but in June 1981 they achieved their ambition of obtaining a ground of their own when they moved to the then derelict Reynolds Field.

Thanks to a small group of volunteers the ground was able to be used from the start of the 1981/82 season and the club was granted Senior status for the commencement of the 1983/84 season.

This enabled them to join the London Spartan League, and they immediately won the Senior Division to gain promotion to the Premier Division where they remained until the amalgamation of the Spartan League with the South Midlands League in 1997/98.

During this period the club enjoyed considerable cup success winning the London Senior Cup in 1991/92 and 1992/93 and being losing finalists in 1993/1994. They also reached the final of the Spartan League cup in 1993/94 and after drawing with Willesden Hawkeye at The Valley, home of Charlton Athletic F.C, they were beaten in the replay.

In 1992/93 they reached the final of the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup where they lost to Harrow Borough at Uxbridge F.C. after extra time. They reached the final of the same competition in 2000/2001 when they were again beaten, this time by Ashford Town (Middx). In 1997/98, their position of 12th in the League meant that in the first season of the Spartan South Midlands League in 1998/1999 that they would be required to play in the Senior Division.

At the end of the 1997/98 season Roy Nairn who had managed the side since 1986 stood down to be replaced by former player Ray Duffy with Roy continuing his association with the club in a coaching capacity. The side immediately gained promotion to the Premier Division finishing in runners up spot to Holmer Green.

Following this promotion, the club maintained a top half position in the League table in each season except for one in the following seven seasons.

HANWELL TOWN HISTORY:

In 2002/03 the club won the Premier Division Cup when they beat Harefield United in the final, their first cup success in ten years. In the same season to celebrate Roy Nairn's twenty years' service to the club, Chelsea sent a side to meet the club at the start of the season.

The Town ran out 5-3 winners with two of the goals being scored by Martin Rowlands of Brentford and QPR and Chris Boothe of Farnborough Town, both of whom having started their careers at the club during Roy's period of managership.

The Rowlands's family have very strong links with the club with dad Arthur having played for the club in the 1982/83 season and since then all five of his sons, Adam, Keith, Martin, Stephen and Anthony have worn the club's colours with Keith now the club's record goalscorer.

In 2004/05, the club led the Premier Division for much of the season only to suffer a dramatic loss of form in the final weeks of the season which allowed Potters Bar Town to finish as comfortable League winners with the Town in second place.

During 2005/06 to ensure that the club met The Football Association's ground grading requirements, the seating capacity of the stand was extended to 180 seats, and covered terracing was erected behind one of the goals. That this work was possible was entirely due to the generosity of the club's president Dave Iddiols and the club's then sponsor Gowing & Pursey Ltd.

Tottenham Hotspur led by Republic of Ireland international and former Brighton and Hove Manager Chris Hughton and managed by former England goalkeeper Ray

Clemence were Town's first opponents under lights and since then Spurs again, Chelsea, Brentford and QPR have all played games on the ground.

At the end of the 2004/05 season club chairman Bob Fisher was awarded a medallion by The Football Association in recognition of his fifty years' service to the club. Subsequently Bob has completed over sixty years' service to the club, a remarkable achievement, which has been recognised by the club in naming the stand after him.

In season 2005/06 with promotion to level Four a key objective, the club managed to finish in third place just edging out Harefield United on goal difference Two thirds of the way through that season Ray Duffy resigned and was replaced as joint managers by his former assistant Danny Vincent and former player Pat Gavin.

Third place enabled Town to win promotion to the Southern League for the 2006/07 season, their first ever season as a Step 4 club. However, Town's stay in the Southern League only lasted one season as they finished second from bottom and were relegated back to the Molten Spartan South Midlands League.

During their stay in the Southern League, Town parted company with the management team of Vincent and Gavin with the reins being taken over by former player Chris Boothe, who himself resigned at the end of the 2007/08 season.

The club finished in seventh place in the Premier Division of the Midlands League in the 2008/09 season and in 12th place in the 2009/10 season. There was a further change in the managerial team at the start of the 2010/11 season with Boysie Wise departing and Jason Tucker stepping into the role of

Although one down at half time Marine's faithful devoured their half time refreshments hopeful their team would rally in the second half. Alas it proved to be the reverse with, to be candid, an insipid second half performance. Marine barely registered a shot on target in the half, were comprehensively outfought all around the pitch, and the only matter of doubt was how many more goals the hosts would score.

In the 53rd minute Frome doubled their lead. Albie Hopkins whipped in an excellent free kick from the right flank which **ARCHIE FERRIS**, with his back to goal, nodded over Marine's keeper into the top corner. Frome now had the game where they wanted it. They defensively got seven or eight players behind the ball and challenged Marine to break them down. It was a test the visitors rarely looked like meeting, and it was the home team who posed the greater goal scoring threat with their swift counter attacks.

On 68 minutes Marine's Dan Brabham was called upon to make a save from Frome's Archie Ferris who got on the end of a Rex Mannings cross. Then with quarter of an hour of normal time remaining the home supporters howled loudly for a penalty when Ethan Vaughan went down in the box. The referee was impressively close to the action and allowed the game to continue. This was certainly not a defeat where Marine could bemoan refereeing decisions – Mr Bromham and his assistants handled the game well.

On 83 minutes the home team secured their comprehensive victory. Albie Hopkins won the ball in front of a square Marine defence. He fed in Archie Ferris who advanced towards goal. He in turn glanced upwards and played a return pass to ALBIE HOPKINS who sold a Marine defender a dummy and slotted home with composed poise. At the final whistle Marine left the field of play heads down and knowing they had under performed. One can make excuses such as the heavy and bobbly surface not suiting Marine's passing style and there is, of course, some truth in that.

However, the cold reality is the home team were hungrier for the result, adapted better to the playing conditions, and collectively worked harder for their victory. This was, in brutal honesty, a decidedly sub-standard and slightly spiritless Marine performance that a focused Frome Town team very effectively took advantage of.

Victorian era Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli once famously said "there are lies, damned lies, and statistics." His argument was that statistics are often flawed. However, sometimes a look at data can be useful in identifying trends. If one looks at Marine's away form, they have in league and FA competitions played 12 away matches winning 2, drawing one and losing nine. In those games they have scored 14 goals and conceded 29. The brutal reality is if you concede approaching three goals a game you are destined to lose considerably more away games than you win.

Dissect the numbers even more deeply and other worrying trends emerge. Marine have a propensity for conceding early goals away from home. In the last six away matches Marine have conceded nine goals in the first twenty minutes. Even worse in those six games they have found themselves 2-0 down in this time span on three occasions. Then add to this pot pourri of statistics that Marine have only opened the scoring away from home in one of their twelve matches.

The reality is if in away games you concede too often too early you give yourself a mountain to climb. In terms of away fixtures the challenge for Marine is how to become more resilient and less defensively vulnerable in those crucial opening skirmishes. With Marine's passing playing style occasional mistakes will happen and there is a need for supporter sanguineness about this. However, when those errors recur frequently, they are no longer sporadic slipups but embedded bad habits that urgently need to be resolved.

Robins offer Marine little Christmas Minutes later Michael Fernandes whipped in a cheer...

Frome Town entered this match bottom of the table and having not won at home this season. They ended the fixture comprehensive threenil victors over an uncharacteristically lacklustre Swindon Supermarine.

The host's victory was totally deserved – they defended resolutely; won most of the 50/50 battles; finished the more clinically; and were collectively hungrier for the win. This was a match that proved that in this league no team is a pushover and if you produce a performance well short of your best you will deservedly lose. Defeat can come in many forms.

There are honourable losses (like Marine's recent defeat at AFC Totton); there are battling reverses; there are finest of margin setbacks; there are beatings when a stronger side is just too good for you; there are unlucky reversals; and there are capitulating defeats where the collective performance really did not deserve anything other than defeat. This was, from a Marine perspective, that last type of loss.

Against a side at the bottom of the table the one thing you do not want to offer them is an early lift. However, in the fourth minute the Robins got their dream start. Frome worked the ball down the right flank. The ball found its way to Rex Mannings who laid the ball off to ALEX MONKS. He took one touch and with no meaningful press fired a twenty-five-yard shot into the far bottom corner of the net.

Marine nearly got back into the match with a couple of chances. One saw Olly Mehew cut in from the right flank, he whipped a ball across the six-yard box, but Harry Williams back heel was blocked.

low cross from the right but the effort from an advancing Marine player cleared the crossbar and clubhouse.

Then on thirteen minutes Marine's Olly Mehew picked up a half clearance on the edge of the box. He did well to create himself an opening but fired his effort wide. On 16 minutes the home team created an opening. James Ollis cut inside from the left flank leaving defenders in his wake.

He found Ethan Vaughan on the edge of the penalty area and his shot was well gathered by Dan Brabham in the Marine goal. The game was now ebbing and flowing. With 23 minutes elapsed Marine's Michael Fernandes pulled a ball back from the left flank that found Anton Dworzak fifteen vards from goal. His well struck effort just cleared the crossbar.

With ten minutes of the half remaining Marine went close again. Michael Fernandes drove a ball into the box and Harry Williams deflected it towards goal, but home team keeper Kyle Phillips made an excellent save. Marine seemed to be building some momentum, but this turned out to be illusory as it was the hosts who finished the first half the stronger. They had three opportunities to score in the closing minutes of the half. Albie Hopkins forced a good diving save from Dan Brabham.

Then minutes later Rex Mannings miscued a cross that struck the top of the crossbar. On the cusp of half time a misplaced clearance from Marine's keeper allowed James Ollis to run at goal, he rounded a defender, but Dan Brabham spared his own blushes making an excellent diving save at the feet of Frome's number 18.

assistant manager to the club's leading goalscorer Keith Rowlands.

After a very promising start to the season, the side fell away drastically at the end of the season eventually finishing in fifteenth position, the lowest spot that they have occupied since gaining promotion to the division at the end of the 1998/99 season.

The club continued to struggle in the 2011/12 season and mid-way through the season, the club reluctantly accepted the resignations of club stalwarts Rowlands and Tucker. They were replaced by a new managerial team of Tommy Williams and Luke Evans.

Despite results improving, the club were unable to climb out of the relegation zone and faced relegation but the demise of clubs at level four, resulted in Town being reprieved from relegation.

At the end of the season both Williams and Evans resigned their managerial roles, and the club turned again to Ray Duffy to hold the managerial reins for the 2012/13 season.

He was aided by Mark Adams and Vince Perdue. The club enjoyed a successful season finishing in 6th position and looked forward to the challenge that a new season would bring.

Season 2013/14 turned out be the most successful in the club's history as they won The Spartan South Midlands League by a margin of fourteen points over Ampthill Town.

They were beaten just once in their fortytwo games, drawing six and winning the other thirty-five with a goal difference of ninety-one, having found the net 127 times and conceding just 36 goals.

They also reached the fifth round of the FA Vase for the first time in their history, losing 3-1 to league rivals Ampthill Town after extra time having had to play their fourth-round tie against Ashford Town just thirty-six hours previously on the Thursday evening.

Promoted back to the Southern League Central Division, the 2014/15 season proved to be another very successful season for the club as playing at their highest ever level and aware that there only previous season as a Step 4 club had resulted in immediate relegation, they not only held their own but finished in seventh place, just outside of the playoffs.

Unfortunately, club manager Ray Duffy resigned at the end of the season, so the club started afresh in season 2015/16 under the managerial reins of Phil Granville, a former player and manager of Uxbridge FC and more recently manager at Harefield United.

However, things did not work out as expected and Granville was relieved of his duties by Christmas and Duffy, fresh from his break, returned to take up the reins. It proved to be a stressful run in to the end of the season and only two 1-0 wins in the space of forty-eight hours against Uxbridge and Ware respectively prevented the club from being relegated.

With the management team having had the time to rebuild the squad over the close season, the 2016/17 season proved to be one in which the club held a relatively comfortable midtable position throughout, and hopes were high that the 2017/18 would see the club finish higher up the table. However, it was not to be with the club finishing too close to the bottom of the table for comfort.

At the end of the 2018/19 season, manager Ray Duffy who had been involved in 997 games for the club as either a player or a

games for the club as either a player or a manager resigned, and the club commenced the 2019/20 season with joint managers in Chris Moore and Wayne Carter.

After the two aborted seasons due to Covid, season 2021/22 proved arguably the most memorable season in the club's history when after an epic playoff win over Chertsey Town, they gained promotion to Step 3, the highest level that they have ever achieved.

Since arriving at Reynolds Field, the club have steadily improved the facilities with the installation of floodlights in 1989, the erection of a small stand and more recently, thanks to a grant from The Football Foundation, the erection of a stand and toilets for disabled persons.

The club have a thriving Youth Section and this season will be fielding circa thirty youth sides. Both the Senior Club and Youth section has achieved charter standard and are highly regarded in the county and the local community.

No account of the history of the club would be complete without paying tribute to four other men who have been prominent in the history of the club. They are Bob Fisher, the club Chairman who has been involved with the club for 67 years and has been first team captain, manager, Treasurer, Chairman and President in his long career.

The second is Phil Player who holds the record number of first team appearances. The third is Ray Duffy who as player and manager amassed 997 first team games and finally, Dave Iddiols, the current President who has been with the club for 45 years.

THE MANAGER:

Chris **Moore**

Chris joined the club as joint manager with Wayne Carter in 2018 and took over sole manager at the end of the 2021/22 season. Moore played in the football league for both Brentford and Dagenham and Redbridge as well as spells with Wealdstone, Uxbridge, Northwood, Chelmsford City, Farnborough Town and Egham Town whilst also being capped seven times for Wales 'C'. Throughout his career he scored over 200 goals.

PLAYERS TO WATCH: GOALKEEPER

Sam Beasant

Sam joined the club from Beaconsfield Town in October 2023. He won the Supporters' Player of the Year and the Southern League Goalkeeper of the Season in the 2023/24 season. An incredibly popular figure around the club and he was named as captain for the 2024/25 season.

DEFENDERS

Dan Carr

Dan made a return to Hanwell Town midway through last season, having spent the early part of the season at Southern Premier South sides Bracknell Town and the Met Police. He has a canny knack of scoring the odd goal or two.

Dwayne **Duncan**

Dwayne joined the club in the 2018/19 season and has been a constant feature of the Geordie's defence ever since. His headed finish against Chertsey Town set Hanwell on their way to victory in the Isthmian South-Central Playoff Final in 2022. He has previously played for Chesham United, Potters Bar and Harpenden Town.

- Using terms of racial abuse and/or discriminatory behaviour.
- The throwing of any object within the grounds and/or on the pitch.
- Entering areas reserved for opposing supporters.
- Smoking in the ground is only permitted in the designated area.
- During matches glasses and bottles must not be taken outside of the clubhouse and alcohol must only be consumed from plastic containers outside of the clubhouse and at pitch side.

The club may, at its discretion, bar any individual of such an offence for a period of up to 5 years. He/she has a right of appeal for reconsideration of the term after a period of 12 months has elapsed. Such an application must be made in writing to the club secretary whose decision will be final.

We ask that all supporters cooperate and observe the following:

- Conduct themselves in an orderly fashion and refrain from anyone or combination of the following: Racism, violence, threatening or abusive behaviour and foul language.
- Vehicles are parked in the car park at the owners/drivers' risk. The club accepts no responsibility for damage to vehicles however caused.
