An overview of Marine's 2024

This is a summary of the key trends from Marine's 2024!

- •In 2024 Marine played 41 league games. The team won 15, drew 10, and lost 16. This meant in 2024 they accumulated 55 points at a points per game of 1.34.
- •In the first half of 2024 the team secured 29 points from 19 games. They won 8, drew 5, and lost 6. This is a points per game ratio of 1.53.
- •In the second half of 2024 the team gained 26 points from 22 games. They won 7, drew 5, and lost 10. This is a points per game ratio of 1.18.
- •Away from home in 2024 Marine won 5, drew 3, and lost 12. This means the team secured 18 points away from home in the calendar year. This equates to a points per game away ratio of 0.9.
- •In home fixtures in the calendar year Marine won 10, drew 7 and lost 5. This equates to 37 points out of a possible 66. This is a points per game ratio of 1.76.
- •In home league matches in 2024 Marine scored 43 and conceded 28 for a goal difference of plus 15.
- •In away league matches in the calendar year the team has scored 28 and conceded 47 for a goal difference of minus 19.
- •If Marine keep their current 2024/25 season points per game ratio, they will secure 49 or 50 points.
- •If the team's form had reached the same level as the second half of 2023/24 the team's point per game ratio would have seen them secure an impressive 64 points.
- •Looking at performances in 2024 the three worst were in my view the 3-0 defeat to Sholing and the 4-1 defeat to Plymouth Parkway both in April 2024, and the 5-2 elimination from the FA Trophy at Winchester City.
- •The best three performances for me were the 5-0 victory against Poole Town in September, the 4-3 victory at Chertsey in October, and the 3-0 victory against Winchester City in April. An honourable mention also for the springtime 2-0 victory at Didcot Town winning despite playing with ten men for 80 minutes.
- •In the first half of 2024 Marine kept four clean sheets in the second half they improved upon this with five.

In terms of an overview of 2024 the current season's league form is not as strong as that achieved by the team in the second half of 2023/24 season. It is though much stronger than the team's early season form in that season. Whilst away form has proved to be problematic throughout 2024 it is very much a positive that home form is so strong.



HISTORY:

The first mention of forming a football club in Hungerford was in the parish magazine of November 1873 when those interested were invited to send their names in, but it wasn't until October 1886 that Hungerford Town Football Club was officially founded.

The club has come a long way since its formation with a vast number of volunteers, supporters and players contributing to its 137-year history.

The original name of the team was Hungerford Swifts and this link with the club's heritage is maintained to this day with a community team now playing under that name in the Hellenic League.

Matches were originally played on "The Downs" which is now Hungerford Common, and then subsequently on the western edge of the town before the club moved to its present ground in Bulpit Lane shortly after World War 1.

Initially, with no organised leagues or cup competitions in existence, the club plaved only friendly matches but soon became a powerful force in local football and won its first recorded trophy in 1905, beating Newbury Union Jack in the final of the Newbury Challenge (Graystone) Cup.

They first entered the Hungerford League and later the Newbury & District League, winning their first league title in 1912/13, before all competitive football ceased during WW1.

The club was immediately successful when the league restarted in 1919 and picked up where they had left off. An influx of new players produced a successful 1st team and Reserve XI, and the club won the Newbury League in both 1920 and 1921.

That era saw the emergence of Reverend Denning, known locally as "the old man", as a driving force and benefactor of the club and the team included many names still familiar in the town to this day.

Hungerford Town continued playing at intermediate level with mixed fortunes in the Newbury & District and the Swindon & District Leagues before senior status was finally achieved in 1958 when joining the ranks of the Hellenic League.

The history of those formative years and the period up until the 1960s is neatly captured in a small booklet called "75 years of Football" written by Frank Horwood in 1961.

The 1970's

After a period of team rebuilding in the 1960's Hungerford began the new decade in fine form and won the Hellenic League Division One and League Cup double in the 1970/71 season.

The 1970's were a "golden" decade for the club and memorable times. We entered the F.A. Cup for the first time in 1973 and the facilities were improved with the opening of a new clubhouse in 1974 and new changing rooms and floodlights added in 1975.

The club reached three Berks & Bucks Senior Cup Finals in four years and although defeats by Chesham United, Slough Town and Wycombe Wanderers were disappointing it was a sign that the club was making significant progress on and off the field.

The 1977/78 season saw Hungerford finish third in the Hellenic League, win the League Cup and produce a fairy tale run in the F.A. Vase eventually losing out to Barton Rovers in a semi-final replay.

These achievements enabled the club to gain election to the Isthmian League in 1978.

HUNGERFORD TOWN HISTORY:

Hungerford Town soon established themselves as a force in the higher level and just missed out on promotion by finishing third in 1979 and 1980.

They created history in 1979 by reaching the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time, losing 3-1 away to Slough Town. That same season they reached their second FA Vase Semi-Final but were again denied a place at Wembley when losing to Guisborough Town 5-3 on aggregate.

The 1980's

Season 1980/81 brought more disappointment with yet another third-place finish in the league but there was some consolation when the club was invited to compete in the prestigious Anglo Italian Semi-Pro tournament.

The 1982 season brought a major trophy when Hungerford defeated Wycombe Wanderers 1-0 at Wokingham Town to win the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup. Promotion was again narrowly missed in 1984/85.

The club then entered a turbulent period for the club when after nine successful years as manager Jim Kelman left the club. The 1988/89 season saw a return to prominence under joint managers Gary Goodwin and David Dodds who guided the club to sixth place in the table and a third FA Vase Semi Final appearance. This time it was Sudbury Town who denied Hungerford its much-deserved trip to Wembley.

The 1990's

The club finished in the top ten of the league table in 1991, 92 and 93 under Gary Goodwin and later ex-Manchester United player Wilf Tranter before a dismal start to the 1992/93 season saw the departure of Tranter at Christmas.

Former Hungerford goalkeeper Jimmy Greenwood briefly returned to the club as manager and achieved Division 2 safety before two ex-players, Gerald (Cabbie) Smith and his assistant Norman Matthews combined to keep the club ticking over in the Isthmian League for the next two seasons.

1996/97 brought the club its highest finish for several seasons but the club entered a transition phase in the late 1990s and although former Swindon Town legend Don Rogers took over as manager, and despite a good run to the 3rd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, the league form was disappointing, and Rogers resigned just after the start of the 1999/00 season.

The 2000's

Gary Ackling took over as manager and sought to change the emphasis of the club by looking for local youth talent and produced a strong mid table finish in 2002.

Unfortunately for the club, the deadline for ground improvements was not met at the end of the 2001/02 season, and a relegation to the newly restructured Isthmian Division 2 followed.

Despite still holding their own the decision was taken for the long-term benefit of the club to re-join the Hellenic League for the 2003/04 season and the club stabilised once more and began the process of rebuilding on and off the pitch.

Former player Alan Clark was appointed manager in 2006 and the league and cup form gradually improved and a push for promotion was mounted once again.

The election of Nigel Warrick as Chairman in 2008 kick started a refurbishment program for the club's facilities and fresh impetus for the team.



A lofted ball into the box saw keeper Sam Beasant charge to the edge of the area in a forlorn attempt to claim the cross. Jordan Edwards was a constant threat up front; Sam Beasant made some crucial saves; Emmerson Sutton was a live wire on the flank; and in the first half Callum Woodcock very much bossed the midfield engine room.

A word of credit to referee Jake Wolley and his assistants. They allowed the game to flow and got all the big decisions right.

From a Marine perspective the second half performance was much better than the first. The introduction of Liban Ibrahim and Anton Dworzak added some much-needed zest to the midfield.

Additionally, centre back Liam Angel returning to the team put in an impressive performance alongside Ioan Richards. Indeed, the back four and keeper did well to stem wave upon wave of first half attacks as the visitors took control of the midfield.

The match also had some absorbing individual battles. The Geordies pacey QPR loanee Emmerson Sutton really tested Ryan Campbell's pace but all credit to the Marine man as he won most of the tussles.

From a Marine perspective a source of frustration is that for whatever reason proven goal scorers Harry Williams and Dave Sims-Burgess are too infrequently receiving the ball in areas where we know they can inflict damage upon opposing teams.

If Marine can solve that conundrum, then there is every reason to hope the wins will soon return.

Despite a sticky start in the league the team went on a 22-match unbeaten run and won the Hellenic League title and promotion to the Southern League.

The 2010's

The 2010/11 season began with a new man in charge, Bobby Wilkinson, and so began the club's most successful decade in its 125year history.

Undeterred by a playoff defeat in 2012 the team finished as runners-up to Poole Town in the league in 2013 and this time there was to be no heartache in the playoffs as Hungerford beat Paulton Rovers and Merthyr Town to win promotion to the Southern League Premier Division, their highest ever level.

Wilkinson steadily improved his squad, and the team settled into Premier League life well. A run of ten wins on the bounce between March and April 2014 took the club to within a point of the playoffs and a magical run to the last 16 of the FA Trophy evoked memories of the wonderful FA Vase runs of the 70s and 80s.

The 2014/15 season saw another strong challenge in the league and the side hit form in the second half of the season to eventually finish 4th and this time a playoff place.

Despite losing to the eventual promotion winners Truro City Bobby Wilkinson and his team were not finished there and vowed to come back stronger than ever.

The 2015/16 season began indifferently with an early F.A. Cup exit and some inconsistent performances in the league but a run to the 2nd Round of the F.A. Trophy, losing to National League side Chester, augured well for the season.

A powerful second half of the season produced a fourth-place finish and yet another crack at the playoffs.

Things looked bleak in the semi-final when the team were two goals down at Hitchin Town on the hour but came back to win 3-2 and on a never-to-be forgotten rainy Bank Holiday Monday at Bulpit Lane another great comeback saw Hungerford beat Leamington 2-1 to achieve promotion to the then Vanarama National League South.

Hungerford's first season in the National League proved that the team could survive at this level despite "punching well above their weight" as a club. At one stage the side was in the playoff positions but eventually finished in 6th position.

The team also reached the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup for the first time in 35 years, losing to National League South champions Maidenhead United.

The 2017/18 season began with thoughts that the side could improve on their position in the League but in August long serving manager Bobby Wilkinson resigned along with his entire backroom staff.

Senior players Jon Boardman and Ian Herring stepped up to the plate as joint managers and steadied the ship before the departure of Chairman Nigel Warrick and necessary cuts in the club's playing budget forced a re-structure and Herring being handed sole charge of the team.

Two seasons of fighting relegation on and off the field ensued but despite the financial struggles Herring and his players kept the club in the National League with successive final day results against East Thurrock United in 2018 and 2019 avoiding relegation.

HUNGERFORD TOWN HISTORY:

In March 2019, following the announcement that several key club personnel would be stepping down, Patrick Chambers stepped forward to become the new Chairman and provide a welcome boost to the club.

Things on the pitch however looked bleak with the team struggling at the bottom of the league. But, just as results picked up, and with an albeit slim but mathematical chance of staying up yet again, the Covid-19 worldwide pandemic struck and all football in the UK was suspended.

The 2020's

In the close season of 2020, with the pandemic causing worldwide chaos, lan Herring departed as manager and the club moved swiftly to appoint former Thatcham Town Manager Danny Robinson.

Robinson had won the Hellenic League title them to win promotion back to the Football and F.A. Vase double in 2018/19, and League in 2010. His other clubs include Thatcham Town were leading Division One Salisbury, Northampton Town, AFC South of the Southern League when the wimbledon, Eastleigh and Torquay United. He joined Hungerford in the summer of 2023

Despite the usual predictions of relegation from those outside the club, and there being no supporters allowed into games, the Crusaders quickly began to surprise many and were in a healthy 7th position in the table when the season was again ended by the pandemic.

With ground improvements completed in recent years, including new changing rooms and the completion of a 400-seater stand in 2021. The team quickly took up where they had left off and were once again challenging for a playoff place before fading towards the end of the season and finishing in midtable.

Alas, Hungerford Town, with the smallest resources in the league, could not repeat the trick for a 7th successive season in the

first time in living memory, back to Southern League. Unperturbed, Danny Robinson assembled a new squad of players who more than held their own in the Southern League Premier South and in the end only narrowly missed out on the playoffs by five points, having dropped far too many points from winning positions.

Hopes are high however, that this 'small but mighty' club can once again defy the odds and continue its remarkable journey. The story continues!

Ryan began his career with Bristol Rovers and had loan spells at Kidderminster Harriers, Southend United and Forest Green Rovers before going on to make over 200 appearances for Oxford United, helping them to win promotion back to the Football League in 2010. His other clubs include Salisbury, Northampton Town, AFC Wimbledon, Eastleigh and Torquay United. He joined Hungerford in the summer of 2023 from Bath City.

A quick and technically gifted defender, MBH graduated from the Hungerford Town Academy having made his Crusaders' debut aged just 17-years-old in the 2015/16 season he then completed a two-year scholarship at Oxford United before being released in 2019 and returned to Hungerford.

WEBBSWOOD STADIUM GROUND REGULATIONS

Swindon Supermarine Football Club reserves the right to prosecute, refuse access to the ground or eject any person who within the club premises is deemed to behave in any of the following ways. Please remember the following activities are illegal, dangerous, carry serious consequences and have no place in our game:

- Entering the field of play.
- Found to be carrying fireworks, flares, smoke canisters, pyro's, knives, and other article that might be used as a weapon and/or comprise public safety are not permitted in the ground.
- Being under the influence of alcohol or drugs within the stadium.
- Taunting opposing supporters.
- The playing of ball games during matchdays is forbidden other than in designated areas.
- The climbing of floodlights, stands or any other structure within the ground is forbidden.

- Using offensive, obscene, or vulgar language and /or gestures.
- Using terms of racial abuse and/or discriminatory behaviour.
- The throwing of any object within the grounds and/or on the pitch.
- Entering areas reserved for opposing supporters.
- Smoking in the ground is only permitted in the designated area.
- During matches glasses and bottles must not be taken outside of the clubhouse and alcohol must only be consumed from plastic containers outside of the clubhouse and at pitch side.

The club may, at its discretion, bar any individual of such an offence for a period of up to 5 years. He/she has a right of appeal for reconsideration of the term after a period of 12 months has elapsed. Such an application must be made in writing to the club secretary whose decision will be final.

We ask that all supporters cooperate and observe the following:

- Conduct themselves in an orderly fashion and refrain from anyone or combination of the following: Racism, violence, threatening or abusive behaviour and foul language.
- Vehicles are parked in the car park at the owners/drivers' risk. The club accepts no responsibility for damage to vehicles however caused.
- Emergency access route must always be kept clear. Any vehicle causing and obstruction will be removed.
- The club management reserves the right to refuse admission to the ground any person who refuses to comply with an instruction from a safety officer or steward or refuses to be searched by a servant of agent of the club or any police officer.

Entry to the ground will constitute an unqualified acceptance of these rules and regulations and the rules of The Football Association and Southern Football League.
